Recent changes by the United States Pharmacopeial Convention have changed the way epinephrine will be labeled. The ratio expressions (1:1,000 and 1:10,000) will no longer appear on packaging, syringes and individual ampules/vials. Instead, only the (mg/ml) strength of the epinephrine will appear. Please inform all of your Paramedic providers immediately and post the attached poster conspicuously at your agency.






