



# MLREMS Training and Education Committee

1. CIU/CLI courses workflow meeting with regional faculty
  - a. Terry Taylor is working on talking with Liz Donnelly at the state to figure out if some of the CIU can be completed online through our learning management system prior to the CIU so time together can be used more effectively.
  - b. Ben has learned more about the process of adding/removing regional faculty. For now, we will try to get all the currently listed regional faculty together in order to standardize this CIU process. Awaiting answers from section (a).
  - c. Need to get dates set for a CIU and a CLI course in the late summer or early fall. Several people expressed the need for an annual CLI course due to the large number of PWIs relative to CLIs.
2. ALS & BLS “Common Core” survey information compilation
  - a. Scope of project is now to create and publish a database/spreadsheet of how different agencies are handling their ALS/BLS core content classes. Linda is taking point on this project. She is having difficulty getting in touch with training officers from different agencies due to turnover. Matt Rudow offered to get contact information for the Battalion 2 agencies.
3. Budget cuts - CLI recertification notification
  - a. The state will no longer be sending a notification to CLIs when they are expiring and need to recertify. Individual CLIs, CICs and course sponsors should be aware of this so we don't lose more CLIs because they expire.
4. Course sponsor renewal application reviews
  - a. Course sponsors need to send the state a renewal application every two years. According to the regulations, the Training & Education committee is supposed to review these renewals and then forward to MLREMS for recommend, recommend with changes, or not recommend the sponsor for renewal. We will receive applications from our course sponsors by April 15 in subsequent years for review at a T&E meeting and then discussion at a MLREMS meeting prior to June 30, when the application are due to the state.
5. New business
  - a. Pass rate published as higher than anecdotal data for CLI exam. Ben's Buffalo colleagues shared a study guide with him that he will pass along.
  - b. Check & Inject training required for all CLIs. Why is there information being put out about using the deltoid? Confusion comes from state-related personnel. Should be given in the thigh.
