- Mark Philippy had sent a letter with a few questions was there proof or evidence provided to the Bureau from Brockport Ambulance that they were operating and if so what was provided?
  - Phone discussion with Director Greenberg: there are other agencies in the State that only take eight calls a year, so our model of ensuring PCR submission each month as proof of operation isn't fair. Response ready is sufficient. Regarding the matter of proof the bureau does have proof that they were operating, however we don't have that in hand here at the Council or Program Agency level. When Brockport went live on iPCR, the Program Agency still does not have access to their system. They are currently moving to NEMSIS V3 and completed all of their paperwork.
- CON Transfers require that all of the assets be transferred and in this case, they are not. We have not received any
  correspondence regarding that. This seems to go back and forth on whether or not this is required. We believe at the Council
  level it is, however this is open to interpretation.
- Concern if they had staffing going they pushed back their start date twice and in correspondence with Lucas to the Monroe County Coordinator, he was going out of town for training and there were some scheduling concerns for COVA. If they are response ready, why did they have to push their start date out twice?
  - Laurie Schwab willing to answer She didn't hire a bunch of full time people because there was delay getting the 911 agreement set up and is a waste of resource.
  - o But we were told that you were staffed.
  - They were staffed per diem, but not 24/7.
    - Zastrow 24/7 is not required. Ready to respond is different.
    - There are agencies that respond outside of the 911 system and they take calls and still operate.
- This ambulance service shut down and left that entire area uncovered for a significant period of time. They said they were closing their doors, figure it out. They shouldn't have been given their CON back, they should have been sanctioned by the State. Regardless of what is happening now they closed their doors without notice, they didn't have a thirty day closure plan, they didn't notify the State, they just said they're out. They didn't turn in their CON as required, they just resubmitted their paperwork and got it renewed.
  - The Bureau has said that the CON is available for transfer. I'm not disagreeing with you, however they said that it is valid.
  - Question for Zastrow: In your opinion, is this the right thing to do and is this going to be successful?
    - I probably shouldn't answer because it's a personal opinion. When it comes to the transfer of the CON, you have to
      evaluate the transfer applicant at the time the paperwork is filed. Unfortunately you can't consider their past, just their
      present. While there were issues in the past, we cannot consider that. At present I have no issues and do think it would
      be successful.

- What happens if we turn this down? Is there another process for review? Greenberg's intent is to look into this process long term (06-06 revisions and recommendations). One of which is creating a State-wide committee to determine CON issues made up of all of the regions. This wouldn't be for this issue, but in the future.
- How do we not consider the financial success? This agency previously closed due to financial issues which have not been addressed.
   This is a large problem across the State with continuous agency closures. While we have the F&C from the State, we don't know that they are financially sustainable in that area.
- It seems like every time we try and follow the State policy 06-06, it's open to interpretation and the policy isn't what is being followed.
   What is the purpose of this process if it's just a rubber stamp? What is the process because it's constantly moving? There are some clear things in 06-06 and find it hard to believe that we can move forward with this being that the State policy was not followed by Brockport.
- Article 30 Section 3010 Area of Operation; Transfers: Heading 2: No ambulance service certificate shall be transferable unless the 0 regional council and the department reviews and approves the transfer as follows: (a) Any change in the individual who is the sole proprietor of an ambulance service shall only be approved upon a determination that the proposed new operator is competent and fit to operate the service. (b) Any change in a partnership which is the owner of an ambulance service shall be approved based upon a determination that the new partner or partners are competent and fit to operate the service. The remaining partners shall not be subject to a character fitness review. (c) Any transfer, assignment or other disposition of ten percent or more of the stick or voting rights thereunder of a corporation which is the owner of an ambulance service, or any transfer, assignment or other disposition of the stock or voting rights thereunder of such a corporation which results in the ownership or control of ten percent or more of the stock or voting rights thereunder by any person, shall be approved based upon a determination that the new stockholder or stockholder proposing to obtain ten percent or more of the stock or voting rights thereunder of such corporation is competent and fit to operate the service. The remaining stockholders shall not be subject to a character and fitness review. (d) Any transfer of all or substantially all of the assets of a corporation which owns or operates a certified ambulance service hall be approved based upon a determination that the individual, partnership, or corporation proposing to obtain all or substantially all of the assets of the corporation is competent and fit to operate the service. (e) Any transfer affected in the absence of the review and approval required by this section shall be null and void and the certificate of such ambulance service shall be subject to revocation or suspension.
  - Motion to approve the application for transfer of Operating Authority from Brockport Volunteer Ambulance Corps to Central Orleans Volunteer Ambulance Inc.
    - o Roll Call Vote. Yes-10, No-8, Abstain-1, Absent-4, Vacant-3, COI-0. Motion fails. For a CON it's the majority of the Council members, not present.



#### o Motion 3 - Failed

• Czapranski – regarding the State Committee Discussion for CONs - EMS and Healthcare is local – with the CON matters there already is an appeals process for the State level, but the original vote should stay with the regional council.
