

Page 2. Impression: Select the impression box and Select COVID-19 (suspected) as your Primary Impression. You may then also select an appropriate secondary impression if applicable.


Page 2. Scene Description: Document your visual assessment from six feet away in the scene description.

History of Present Illness

Requested to provide BLS assessment of a patient with flu like symptoms. Patient states that he has been able to work until two days ago with flu like symptoms consisting of fever (100.5 PO), chills, malaise, loss of appetite, a dry non-productive cough and a 3/10 dull headache. He states that he has been able to drink water and some dry toast but hasn't wanted anything more to eat. Patient states that he recently returned from visiting family in New Rochelle, NY where he may have been exposed to COVID-19 patients but he is unsure. He states that he summoned EMS today because he would like testing. He is otherwise complaint free and denies shortness of breath, chest pain, dizziness or palpitations. He states that has still been coming to work because his office is otherwise empty. Patient states that he has been alternating Tylenol and Motrin for his low grade fever and headache.
