## Medical Director's Report - Jeremy Cushman, MD

- Sepsis Protocol
  - Education roll-out has been completed and that will be released this week so the
    protocol as well as an almost one hour video training that is amenable for both ALS and
    BLS providers and that will be done at the agency level over the next few months.

## <u>Program Manager's Report – Benjamin Sensenbach</u>

- 2015 Report
  - o 26,000 hours of CMEs have been tracked, 200 PAD uses or notices of intent, provided coverage for multiple meetings, continue to make sure the physicians are credentialed to answer the med control phones. Developed two different podcasts last year, one for the total artificial heart and one for sepsis. Dr. Cushman provided ketamine training to all of the RSI providers in the region. 22 BLS agencies are using intranasal naloxone and we continue to support their efforts. Du. Cushman actually even pursued some additional grant funding so that we can support all of the region's BLS naloxone efforts.

- We have three agency level referrals that we're following for the February committee meeting and then the other piece to add which we are sponsoring ourselves there will be a Just Culture training coming up which I believe the class is almost full.

- SEMAC
  - The State has approved CPAP to be provided at the BLS level. This first has to be released by the State in terms of policy and how that will be handled, and then we as a REMAC will need to make the determination as to whether or not we wish to add that within the scope of practice for our BLS providers and if that passes, it needs to be approved at the agency level.
  - Suffolk County area is doing a pilot project on EMT insertion of King airways in cardiac arrest patients.
  - Approval of spinal immobilization restriction state protocol approved. Waiting on DOH for education to include MDs & RNs, goal of 2016.

#### **Old Business**

- Ebola
  - o Removal of Mali as a country of interest.
  - We'll continue to update our algorithms and EMS plans as our respective Health
     Departments and CDC change how we are managing this infectious disease.
- Narcan
  - Fire departments, law enforcement and BLS transport agencies that wish to participate in delivering naloxone to patients in the community can contact our office.
  - We are currently receiving Narcan thanks to the great State of New York for distribution to those entities
  - We cannot provide them to an ALS agency.
  - We have had well over 140 reversals by BLS administering naloxone in this county alone in the last year.

#### **New Business**

- Rural Metro is now providing albuterol, blood glucose determination at the BLS level pursuant to the State Policy.
- REMAC committee by-laws have not been updated since 2009. We are looking for volunteers
  from this body to serve on the revision of these by-laws. If interested, please contact Mark

- Is there anything you think that we should be really focusing on and making it a priority for REMAC this year?
  - o Epi-Pens
    - Many of the fire departments in Monroe County are no longer carrying epi-pens because it is just prohibitively expensive. The State requires that all BLS transport agencies have both an AED and epi-pen for both adults and pediatrics.
