- 1. Training funds request
 - a. How do we verify the validity/quality of training for which we receive a training request?
 - b. Is it our responsibility, or that of the council itself, to weigh the council's finances relative to training requests? Probably council itself.
 - c. How will the 35 people chosen for the last session (35 person cap) be chosen if there are more than 35 people interested? Needs to be somewhat equitable across agencies.
 - d. Training will be supported by T&E.
- 2. Preceptor training requirements should all regional ALS preceptors be required to take the current preceptor training class (new as of 5/15) in order to be a preceptor? Would "reset" the ALS preceptor list so it is current.
 - a. Those people who have already taken the update session would not need to take it. Current training is being modified so it will consist of an online Cypherworks portion and an approximately 1 hour "in person" portion as a follow up. Will allow more flexibility for providers to take the class and more opportunity for the class to be offered by DPM.
 - b. Programs like MCC could have an add-on module geared to meeting their accreditation requirements that ALS preceptors would have to take in order to precept students from that particular program.
 - c. If scheduling could be reasonable within the time period required for ALS preceptors to "update" then this is something T&E supports. Would need to have solid notification to all current preceptors/agencies.
- 3. Active practice requirements is the portion requiring 30 primary patient contacts annually a good metric?
 - a. 30 contacts are required to be within MLREMS. Is this important when other regions are now also using the collaborative protocols? Probably not. Also, not ideal for providers whose full-time positions are at agencies outside of MLREMS.
 - b. Does not account for knowledgable, experienced providers who might be very qualified even without meeting the requirement vs. new providers. Also, doesn't account for people in management positions who need to maintain their ALS credentials but do not get many primary patient contacts.
 - c. Should it be something that can be waived at the discretion of the agency medical director?
 - d. No suggestions for a better metric at this time.
