- Finance and EMS look at investigating affiliations for agencies going training to make sure that their affiliation exists and that the applicant was truthful on their documentation, putting in or submitting for recerts
- HIV status-when they refinanced the research piece, they left off the protection for fire, police and EMS. 63.8M explains how to get the status of a patient giving certain criteria
- Atropine has been distributed to EMS agencies. Monroe County was one of the first rolled out. Follow the Mark One protocols
- Continuous care regarding 12 lead EKG and constant ET wave form capnography for ETT, NYS DOH trying to work out the hospital continuing the care
- SEMAC, no quorum, no business
- On January 1st, 2009, wave form capnography is to be used for all patients that are intubated. REMAC can granted an extension to demonstrated hardship in their region if it is presented adequately to REMAC. For a trouble breathing patient or a pediatric patient, you cannot intubate them after January 1st, 2009 without wave form.
- Senate 2341 allows volunteer fire departs to bill for EMS.
- Assembly or senate 7683 which is the MOLST forum which removes the sunset date at the end of this month, makes it statewide so the EMS providers across the state and it makes it permanent legislation.
- SEMSCO also supported assembly 10970 and the senate version which is S7775
 extending EMS certification for those in our military who are on active duty and not able
 to recertify.
