COVID-19 Public Safety Pre-Duty Screening Last Updated 3/19/2020 9:16 PM

Purpose:

To prescreen individuals for illness prior to duty and at the end of shift or after 12 hours of duty.

Process:

Have a supervisor screen the individual when reporting to work. Alternatively, consider using a modified ICS 211p, and have individual check-in and attest to the absence of symptoms at the start of shift. Personnel should be reassessed at the end of shift or after 12 hours of continuous duty.

Individuals should not work if they have ANY of the following:

- a. Fever whether measured or not
- b. Cough
- c. Body Aches
- d. Sore throat
- e. Difficulty Breathing

If possible, take the individual's temperature or have them take it themselves. If temperature is greater than 100.4°F (38°C), they should not work. To take a temperature, consider using disposable temperature strips or an infrared temperature device to reduce chances of cross-contamination.

Medical Screening REQUIRED Prior to Entry

All individuals entering attest to not currently having ANY of the following:

- Fever whether measured or not
- Cough
- Body Aches
- Sore throat
- Difficulty Breathing

If you cannot attest to the above, you will not be granted entry.

Take your temperature and record it on the ICS 211p.

If your temperature is greater than 100.4°F (38°C), you will not be granted entry.

Your signature on the ICS 211p indicates your attestation that you have none of the above symptoms nor have a measured temperature.
